Hershel Wall served in the United States Army from October 1965 to August 1973, where he achieved the rank of Sergeant. Wall, a resident of Antlers, Oklahoma, received training at Ft. Polk, Louisiana, Ft. Rucker, Alabama and Ft. Eustis, Virginia. He was stationed at Ft. Benning, Georgia and Ft. Carson, Colorado. He also served in Vietnam and Germany.

Wall served with D Troop 1710<sup>th</sup> Calvary and 106<sup>th</sup> Transport Company, 10<sup>th</sup> Aviation Group. He was a helicopter Mechanic, retiring as an E-5.

Sergeant Wall received the Vietnam Campaign with 60 Devices, Vietnam Service Medal with six Bronze Service Stars, Good Conduct Medal, three Overseas Bars, Aircraft Crewman Badge, Meritorious Unit Citation, Sharpshooter Badge (Rifle M-14) and the Expert Badge (Rifle M-16).

Wall was selected as the April 2021 Choctaw Nation Veteran of the Month. He was presented a commendation certificate and framed Choctaw and US Flag, courtesy of the Tribal Council and Chief.
