

Fobb, Edmond

Private First Class Edmond Fobb, Co E, 142nd Infantry, 36th Division, was KIA on October 8, 1918 near St. Etienne, France by machine gun fire. "Pvt Edmond Fobb was killed in action about 7 am, October 8, 1918 at the battle of St Etienne. He was struck by a machine gun bullet in the forehead just about the edge of the hair; when struck he fell forward on his face and was dead by the time he struck the ground. At the time he was struck, he was in between two small scopes of woods just southeast of St. Etienne. Pvt. Fobb was buried near Gravel Pat just southeast of St. Etienne. (Witness: cpl. Joseph Crittenden, Co E. 142nd Infantry). Note: AG Report lists date of death as October 9, 1918. He was reinterred to the Meuse-Argonne Cemetery. He was from Eagletown.

Fobb was posthumously awarded the French Croix de Guerre with Palm.
