



McKee Folsom Robinson Jr.

1895-1979

b. Caddo, Blue Co., Choctaw Nation

Known as “June” or “Junie,” he was the son of tribal council member McKee Folsom Robinson Sr. and Lorena Daney.

He was drafted into the Army in early 1918, and assigned to Company K, 58th Infantry Regiment, 4th Infantry Division. He sailed from the US in early October 1918, aboard the Lycaon, a British merchant cargo ship operated by the Blue Funnel Line (Alfred Holt and Company) that played a significant role in both World War I and World War II.

He saw combat in the last part of the Meuse-Argonne Offensive, then was part of the Army of Occupation in Germany.

He returned home on July 24, 1919, sailing on the USS Mt Vernon -- departed from Brest, France, arrived at Hoboken, NJ. This boat had been hit by German torpedo in September 1918 (pictured in dry dock).
